Plein Air Sketching: The planned workshop for April 6 under the Wisteria at Civita Park has been changed. We will meet at Balboa Park, Room 104, 9:00-12 noon for a brief meeting. Then we will select a location for sketching to suit the weather. If sunny, we will walk over to the Botanical Gardens Building & Reflection Pool for sketching. The other choice (if cold outside) is to check out Room 101 for the Turtle & Tortoise Exhibit. Once we have sketched, return to the room and paint or paint at location.

Bring all your regular painting equipment. For Plein Air you will need a backpack/bag for a sketch book (9x12), pencil, eraser, sharpener, fine point ink pens, colored pencils, folding Chair w/pad, hat, camera, or whatever you're most comfortable using

**The Exhibition of Fine Art** is a highly competitive and extremely popular juried competition featuring both 2-D and 3-D entries. The artwork includes many variations of drawing, painting, mixed media, sculptures, ceramics and more.

This competition awards more than \$18,000 in cash and prizes each year and is open to artists ages 18 years and older. The art exhibit is an opportunity for artists to have their artwork viewed by a large number of art enthusiasts who visit the exhibit each day. Artwork must be original and must have been completed within the last three years. Selected artwork remains on display in the East Grandstand for the duration of the San Diego County Fair.

Be sure to enter as many masterpieces as possible in the Asian Art Division (21) of the Fine Arts. With a generous contribution from one of our members, we have five (5) entries available if this may be a barrier for you.
